The quarry industry takes pride in the professionalism of its members and each year the Institute of Quarrying NZ (Inc.) offers awards to recognise excellence in numerous categories. The Awards are presented at the Quarry NZ Conference held annually in July.



Winstone Aggregates Safety Award

The Winstone Aggregates Health and Safety Award is awarded to the quarry operation judged to have **implemented an improvement or idea** resulting in a shift change in the engagement or participation of the workers on site, as well as improving the site's health or safety risks.

Sponsored by Winstone Aggregates, this trophy recognises that there has been a shift in mindset at the operation when it comes to health and safety

and is a very prestigious award.

Nominations for this award can be made by any branch of the IOQ NZ (Inc.) or any quarry operation and must be supported in detail on the reasons for the nomination.

This most coveted trophy is presented through the IOQ NZ (Inc.) by Winstone Aggregates and is in the form of a large mounted crystal.


WorkSafe's Chief Inspectors Safety Leadership Award



The WorkSafe Chief Inspector Safety Leadership Award recognizes demonstrated commitment to continuous improvement and safety leadership in the area of workplace health and safety, in both the extractives and extractives support sectors.

The award will be aimed at a Company rather than an individual operation/site.

R D Hassed Award



This trophy is awarded annually to a New Zealand member of the Institute who has made the most outstanding contribution to the Branch during the current year. Nominations for this award can be made by any member of the Institute or any group committee. This trophy remains the property of the IOQ NZ (Inc.) and is held by the current recipient for the twelve months following its presentation at the Institute's NZ Annual Conference normally held in July each year.

The trophy is a piece of limestone containing a scallop shell fossil from Pakipaki Quarry in Hawkes Bay, and is mounted on a wooden base.

Lyn Jordan Memorial Trophy



This award is for the "Best Technical Paper" given at an Institute Branch Meeting or the Quarry NZ Annual Conference.

The award is in memory of the late Lyn Jordan who was an early member of the IOQ NZ (Inc.) and is in the form of a vintage exploder donated by the Explosives Division of ICI NZ Ltd (now Orica). The trophy remains the property of the IOQ NZ (Inc,) and is held by the current recipient for the twelve months following its presentation.

TerraCAT Award



The TerraCat Award is a \$3,500 travel grant, towards the cost of travel within New Zealand or Australia for **the operator that has consistently shown the most dedication and commitment to the quarrying industry.**

Turnco - Astec Achievement Award



This award recognises an **achievement by an IOQ NZ (Inc.) member** working individually or as part of a team. The intent is to reward a person or team directly responsible for plant operation, or in plant maintenance, or in problem-solving in the industry. The award offers the opportunity to reward an achiever or team, who may not necessarily be conspicuous within the industry.

Komatsu Leadership Award - not available for 2025



This award is presented to an Institute member who has achieved 10 or more years membership, holds a management position within the quarrying industry and has made a valued contribution to the Institute.

This prestigious award is presented every two years and includes an overseas trip.

B R Webster Family Educational Scholarship

The Scholarship is awarded to individuals who are studying towards a nationally recognised qualification in order to advance their career within the quarrying sector. The scholarship includes all course fees, travel, accommodation and incidental expenses up to \$3,000 per annum, up to a maximum of three years.

Scholarship recipients must be an IOQ NZ (Inc.) member.

RJ & AJ Loader Sponsors Shield



This award in the form of a shield donated by Andy & Raewyn Loader is for **the best sponsor's display judged annually at the Quarry NZ Conference.** The trophy remains the property of the IOQ NZ (Inc.) and is held by the current recipient for the twelve months following its presentation.

Additional Awards & Citations



The <u>INSTITUTE OF QUARRYING NZ AWARD</u> is very much the 'members award' and awarded by IOQ NZ (Inc.) to **formally recognise both a long-serving member who is held in high regard because of a long period of outstanding service to the Institute, and/or a retiring President at the end of his tenure on the Executive Council. This Award is, above all, a measure of the esteem in which the nominee is held by his colleagues, and is made in the true spirit of Institute fellowship.**

A <u>CITATION</u> is similar to the IOQNZ (Inc.) Award except that it formally recognises a long-serving member who has not held a position on the Executive Council.

<u>HONORARY FELLOWS</u> are elected by the NZ Executive Council and will be a person who has rendered such service to the Institute or the industry generally as warrants honorary fellowship and who has:

- i) made a significant contribution to the Institute or to the industry, or
- ii) holds a position in the Institute or the Industry which merits such recognition.

The <u>CAERNARFON AWARD</u> is presented annually for the **best paper given at an Institute** conference, seminar, meeting etc anywhere in the world which is adjudged to have contributed the most to the advancement of some aspect of the industry - either technical, environmental or strategic etc. Originally, the <u>Caernarfon Award</u> was endowed by the North Wales branch and it is named after the town where the very first Institute meeting took place in 1917. The award has been made by Council in the UK in the past, but in 1998, responsibility for the adjudication was assumed by the International Presidents' Committee.
